When Should My Child Stay Home?

It is very important that **your child be at school everyday he/she is well**. There are many inclass learning opportunities which cannot be reproduced at home. This includes learning which occurs during class discussions, hands on experiences, and through student communication. Please emphasize **good and prompt attendance** with your child. However, we don't want students at

school if they are truly sick. You can help us out by:

-Keeping your child who is sick at home. When you call them off, please report the type of illness and/or symptom. -Teach your child to wash hands a lot with soap and water for 20 seconds. (Try having him/her sing the alphabet while washing hands.) Be sure to be a good example yourself.

-Teach your child to cover coughs and sneezes with tissues or by coughing into the inside of the elbow. -People who are sick should stay home from work or school and avoid people until they are better.

-When your child is free of a fever for 24 hours, he/she can return to school.

-Remember when your child returns to school, to send him/her with a note or doctor's note with child's full name, date absent, and reason.

Career Cruising is a new program located on the School City of Hobart website under Cool Tools. Children in elementary school should have a PLAN for success. Career cruising offers levels of elementary career exploration for Grades K-2 and 3-5. The program uses ccSpark!, which is a fun, educational role-playing game called Sparkdale to help younger students learn about careers, life-planning, and social skills. It is unique, age-appropriate, and inspiring. Students can login, and visit the My Profile tab to update basic career information about themselves, such as goals, jobs at home, and study habits. If you have Internet access at home, your child can use this program at home. Give it a try!
