Reading Strategy

Use Main Idea and Supporting Details to Determine Importance
When reading with your child, stop frequently and ask your child what they think the selection is about, Then, ask your child to give you one detail to support their thought. Remind your child that readers may think differently about what the author's main point is in a selection. When a reader decides what they believe to be the main idea, evidence from the text must be given as support.

Words to use:

Topic=the subject, what the text is about.

Main Idea-most important idea about the topic.

Supporting Details-bits of information used to support main idea.

Questions to ask:

In a few words, what is the selection about?

What do you think is the most important idea about this topic?

Did you find the main idea written in the passage or did you infer it?
