## Reading Strategy

## Flip the Sound

This is a strategy good readers use when they come to a word that doesn't sound right or make sense. Knowing the multiple sounds a letter or letter combination can make and being able to flip the sounds around is an essential skill of a good reader.

When your child reads a word incorrectly, wait until they get to the end of the sentence. Then, stop your child and ask, "Did the word you just read sound right?"

Say: "Try flipping the sound."

When good readers use the strategy of flip the sound, they listen for a word they recognize. Then they check to make sure that word makes sense in the sentence.

Ask, "What other sound can that letter make?"

This is comparable to the cross checking strategy-"Does it look right?, Sound right?, or Make sense?"
