

Did you know that the number of words a child is exposed to between ages 0-3 is significantly related to that child's ultimate intellectual and academic success? Studies have shown that the more



parents talk to their children, the faster children's vocabularies grow and the higher the IQ test scores are at age 3 and later. These studies have also revealed a significant inequality in children's early language environments: children from families of lower socioeconomic status hear approximately 30 million less words than their peers from higher socioeconomic families. Dr. Dana Suskind, founder of Thirty Million Words Initiative, is determined to help parents level the playing field. There are three simple things that every parents should do to ensure that his or her child is hearing as many words as possible: Tune In, Talk More, **Take Turns.** These strategies can make a difference with your child starting NOW. News from the Office

-Remember to have your child dress for the weather. Students are able to play in the snow area if they have winter boots, gloves, and snow pants.

Attendance is so important to your child's education. If it is necessary for your child to miss school, a parent must call to inform the office AND the child must return with a letter or doctor's note.

-Remember if your child purchases meals at school, to put money into your child's account ahead of time. Meal charging is allowed for Emergency purposes only.

Payment on those charges should be sent to school in a timely manner.

-Be sure your child is up to date with **immunizations.** It is important that all medical records are turned into the office as soon as possible. Students who are not compliant will receive exclusion letters.
