Indiana Criminal Gang Policy – Meeting Notes 4-12-16

 Look at the definition of Criminal Gang and incorporate language (gang activity) in the definition. Criminal gang refers to activity that would lead to a criminal charge. We want to ensure that law enforcement can still pursue charges of mischief or vandalism.

Criminal gang charges are rarely filed by the prosecutor because it is difficult to prove the offense was a result of gang activity.

The Program is intended as an immunization against delinquency, youth violence, and gang membership for children in the years immediately before the prime ages for introduction into gangs and delinquent behavior.
