SAY NO TO HOUSE BILL 1003 - THE SCHOOL VOUCHER BILL

- 1. This bill is different. It will shatter the barrier between church and state in K-12 schools observed since the 1851 Constitution.
- 2. It will blur the line between athletic recruiting and granting vouchers to attend private schools with powerhouse athletic programs, all paid for by taxpayers.
- 3. This is not a low-income plan. It gives a voucher of as much as \$4000 to a family of four making \$81,000.
- 4. It will divert \$74 million from public schools to private schools if 20,000 students switch to fill seats available at private/parochial schools. When public school budgets are being flat-lined, this is not the time to undermine these budgets in this way.
- 5. It raises the private school scholarship tax credit from 50% to 80%. When falling revenue has put public school budgets in a tailspin, this is not the time to add a tax cut to benefit private schools.
- 6. Public schools are open to all, including the disabled. Private schools are not.
- 7. Public schools have been the bedrock of our democracy for over a hundred years.
- 8. Public schools are centers of the community. Switching to private school funding will fragment the community along religious, philosophical and socio-economic lines.
- 9. The bill does not require private schools to be state accredited to get tax money.
- 10. The bill undermines public education and will slowly drain the public schools of Indiana. As Milton Friedman, the inventer of the voucher plan, wrote in <u>Free to Choose</u>: "The possibility exists that some public schools would be left with the dregs."
