

What is Early College/ Dual Credit/ Concurrent Enrollment?

- 1. Student is enrolled in college course while at high school
- 2. Teacher is qualified to teach college-level course
- 3. Course is approved by both high school and college
- 4. Course appears on transcript at both HS and college
- 5. Grade applies to HS and college GPA
- 6. Tuition is charged by college (at a greatly reduced rate, or waived entirely)
- 7. College rules about add/drop, tuition, grading deadlines, etc. are followed, in addition to those at the high school.

courses are designed to effectively focus on vocational and career education and are open to 11th and 12th grade students. Not only are students able to explore and learn about a specific career, but also the vocational education component provides the opportunity to prepare for entry-level employment in occupations requiring skilled workers. Students take classes at PCCTE for half of the day and spend the other half at HHS. There are so many great opportunities at PCCTE!

Compare AP to Early College

<u>AP</u>

- College-level expectations
- Final grade in HS course on <u>HS</u> transcript <u>only</u>
- College transcript entry depends on AP <u>score</u>
- Use of AP course may vary
 within the student's college
 major, or toward college
 degree, depending on score.
 Different application of AP
 results from college to college.

Early College

- College-level expectations
- Final grade on <u>both</u> HHS and college transcript
- College transcript entry is "automatic"—same grade as HHS
- Use of course toward degree requirements may vary; credits are <u>transferrable</u> to other colleges. When transferred, credits may be used differently by another college.

For example, if a student took the Reading section for the first time on August 1st, 2016, and then tested two additional times in that same academic cycle—the next time they could take the Reading section would be August 2st, 2017.

The Medical Assisting program will prepare students to become a Medical A stant, which is a growing career in the medical field. Medical assistants make around \$13.77 per hour an are in high demand in Northwest Indiana.

Classes will focus on patient care, venipuncture, electrocardiogram, vital signs, injections, medical coding ectronic charting and medical records. Students will learn in a variety of settings, including a computer la phlebotomy lab, laboratory skills lab, and clinical skills lab with two fully functioning patient exam ms. This training prepares students to sit for the Certified Medical Assistant certification exam through merican Association of Medical Assistants, which is becoming a credential requirement for most employer
