High School

Middle School

Both encourage students to be aware of the impact of their words and actions on the lives of others and to set goals for a purposeful life.

Elementary School

Rachel's Story - encourages students to say kind words and do simple acts of kindness and to show that the actions of just one person can make their school a better place.

Team LEAD Philosophy

To create a social climate change among kids, kids must take ownership of that change. External components such as teachers, parents, and even high school or college mentors alone cannot affect the kind of marked social climate change we'd like to create. Bystander Leadership/Support Groups have proven to be a key component in creating that sense of ownership that empowers kids to change the social climate.

Maintaining safer schools and communities requires a multi-faceted approach. Bullying, relational aggression, depression, cutting, and so on are symptoms of underlying issues such as a breakdown of positive leadership skills, character, resilience, school connectedness, and accountability. Each school or community will have special needs and strengths, and will, therefore, create a unique program tailored to best serve its own population. Social climate change requires continuous, broad-based restructuring of social norms which is an on-going process and, therefore, ever changing.

Bystander Leadership Program

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"Team LEAD empowers students to become leaders in their school and community. Sometimes the evidence is so obvious as in the service they provide i.e. nursing home visits, Christmas caroling, food pantry assistance, program support in the schools and community. Then there are those profound moments when a parent tells you that if it were not for a Team LEAD member helping her child cope with the loss of a loved one, s/he would have never made it. These same Team LEAD students tackle bullying by identifying where it is occurring (actual maps of building) and offering solutions to stop it. There is also the taking on of social issues in the school community including drugs and teenage pregnancy in their I RED campaign where they marketed to students to Re-evaluate Every Decision. The students in Team LEAD are leaders in every aspect because they are making a difference in young people's lives."
