

ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

Preparing for College and Careers

College and Career Readiness Course / 9th Grade Study Hall

All freshman students are required to take one semester of College and Career Readiness and one semester of a study hall. The College and Career Readiness class will give students the opportunity to explore careers and colleges and create a plan for after high school. Students will earn an elective credit towards graduation if they successfully pass the course.

















CCRT

College and Career Readiness time, or CCRT, is similar to a homeroom where students have assistance and support preparing for life after high school. This time is set aside 1-2 times per month and is required for all students. Our expectation is that all students utilize this time to prepare themselves for their future.

GPA / TRANSCRIPTS

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Daily Schedule

Hobart High School is on a Block 8 schedule. This means that students are scheduled for eight classes each semester. Students attend 4 of these classes on Purple Days and the other 4 on Gold Days. This alternating day schedule allows for 90 minute periods during the day.

On a regular school day, classes begin at 7:45 a.m. and end at 2:36 p.m. with each day consisting of four 90-minute periods. We have four nine-week grading periods per year.

Late Start Wednesday – PLC Time

All School City of Hobart teachers work in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). This is a time for professional development and collaboration. Every Wednesday, students start school 30 minutes later. See adjusted time schedule on the Daily Schedule page.

Attendance Procedures

Parents or guardians are requested to call Student Services at 942-7312. In order for an absence to be excused, the parent / guardian must call by 7:20 the following morning.

Prearranged Absence

Please call 942-7312 in advance if you know your child will be leaving early. Students will then receive a prearranged pass from the attendance office. The student needs to sign out in Student Services at the requested time. Upon returning to HHS, students will need to go to Student Services to sign in and receive a pass to class. Please bring all medical notes to Student Services to document an absence.

TOTAL ALLOWED:

4— excused per class

7- excused / exempt (this includes medical / funeral, etc.) See Handbook for more details.

Tardy Policy

Tardies are calculated in a cumulative manner. Instead of calculating tardies strictly by period, tardies are counted as a whole per semester. Excessive tardies will result in the following consequences:

Tardies / Consequence

8 Total → Friday School Detention

10 Total → Saturday School Detention

12 Total ----- Loss of extracurricular dance / Talent Show privileges for the next scheduled event (Homecoming, Semi, Prom, Talent Show or any other Admin Approved Social Function)

If a student accumulates 20 tardies in ONE semester, they must forfeit their dance /Talent Show / other Admin approved social function privileges for the remainder of the school year. In addition, at 20 tardies, a parent conference will be held with the parent, student, and one of the principals.

After 10 total tardies, every additional four (4) tardies will result in a Saturday School Detention.

When a student reaches eight (8) tardies in any one class, the student will lose credit for the semester.

Final Exams Count!

Finals tend to sneak up on most 9th grade students. Students will take final exams at the end of each semester (January and June). Each semester is made up of two nine-week grading periods (2 quarters) and one final exam. The grade students receive each nine weeks accounts for 40% of their final grade and the final exam accounts for 20%. If you look at each semester, it is comprised of three parts. In order to pass a class, a student must pass two of the three parts. Below is the break down:

SEMESTER 1	Quarter 1 40%	Quarter 2 40%	FINAL EXAM 20%	=	FINAL GRADE THAT GOES


college credit for taking certain classes in high school!

When is Lunch?

The lunch schedule is determined by a student's 3rd and 7th period teachers. On the first day of school, all of the offices and classroom teachers will post the lunch schedule. It will list the teacher's last name and specify A, B or C lunch.

FRIDAY AND SATURDAY SCHOOL DETENTION INFORMATION

Friday and Saturday School detentions are assigned for various reasons. Here is some important information to know about each:

FRIDAY SCHOOL DETENTION

- Meets after school on designated Fridays from 2:45-4:15.
- Students are not permitted to use electronic devices, talk to one another, pass notes, or leave for any reason.
- Failure to attend will result in a Saturday School Detention.

SATURDAY SCHOOL DETENTION

- Meets on the designated Saturday from 8 a.m.— 11 a.m.
- Students must arrive on time and enter through door 23. Doors will lock promptly at 8:05.
- Students are not permitted to use electronic devices, talk to one another, pass notes, or leave for any reason.
- Failure to attend the Saturday Class will result in a full day of In-School-Suspension (ISS) or Out of School Suspension (OSS) depending on the frequency of the missed detention.

In addition, any student who fails to attend a Friday School or Saturday School will NOT be eligible to attend any after school social events for the remainder of the semester (i.e. Homecoming, Semi, Prom, talent show, or any other Administrative approved social function.) For example, a student who has a scheduled Friday School in February, but fails to attend, will not be allowed to attend Prom or participate in the Talent Show.

If a student cannot attend a Friday or Saturday School for any reason, his / her parent MUST contact a building principal prior to the scheduled detention and have the absence excused / rescheduled.

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Truancy Policy

A truancy occurs when a student is absent without the consent of a parent / teacher / administrator for any part of the school day OR when a student is found in an area of the school without permission. Below are the consequences HHS enforces:

Electronic Device Policy

Personal electronic devices are not to be used during instructional time unless approval has been given by the classroom teacher. Electronic devices can be used during passing periods and during lunch hours as long as it does not interfere with the educational environment. Refer to the student handbook for specific guidelines. Using an electronic device in a way that violates our school policy will result in the following disciplinary action:

1st Violation— Friday School 2nd Violation— Saturday School 3rd Violation—Out of School Suspension Subsequent offenses will result in continued OSS days

Book Bags

Students are not allowed to carry book bags during school hours. Purses must also not be large enough to hold a standard size text book. If a student is bringing a laptop to school, they are permitted to use a bag to carry the device to prevent damage.

Bus Transportation

The majority of our 9th grade students ride the bus. Students are only allowed to ride their assigned bus. Under no circumstance will an administrator sign a pass for a student to ride a different bus. We also take bus referrals very seriously since safety is our top priority. Continued bus referrals will result in a loss of bus riding privileges.

Any questions regarding bus routes or drop off / pick up locations should be directed to our Transportation Service Center at 947-2413.

Lockers

Each student is assigned a locker at HHS. Locker numbers and combinations are handed out with schedules. For problems, please contact Student Services. It is important to note that students are responsible for the contents of their locker, and the school is not responsible for items presumed stolen or missing in any way. We do not recommend bringing valuables to school, and we deter students from purposefully jamming lockers, or sharing lockers with another student.

PE Uniforms

Hobart High School students must purchase a gym uniform for gym class. The uniform can be purchased through the PE Teachers at a cost of \$20.

Dropping Off Items

We do not interrupt class to notify students of dropped off items. Also- we do not allow parents to drop off fast food to students for lunch. A student can purchase lunch in our cafeteria.

Dress Code

Students are encouraged to "Dress for Success" at HHS. The student handbook outlines the complete dress code and parents and students should read through it before the start of school. Any student who is in violation for the dress code will have the opportunity to change into something the school provides. If the student refuses to change—they are sent home for defiance (OSS) for the rest of the day.
