For Leadership teams to be chosen, they had to compete against 1,750 other JROTC units nationally in a series of online leadership and current event tests. The Academic Team of Morgan Lundstrom, Amjad Umrani, John Yzenas and Isaiah Hayes also competed in an SAT and current events competition. Both teams won 1st place in the Midwest Region and had the highest qualifying scores in the nation for the second year in a row. This was the third in the last four years a Hobart team has competed in the National Finals. In 2008, Erick

Pistello, Darrel Clark, Mitch Weidinger and Darren Bood traveled to The Virginia Military Institute, and in 2009, Morgan Lundstrom, Steven Somers, Anne Malinoff and Phil Yarbrough traveled to Washington, D.C. and competed in the Academic Bowl National Championships.
